

Attic Window Block Study To Amazing 3D quilts

Explore the three perspectives one can create using the traditional Attic Window quilt block. Students will learn how to fussy cut fabrics when working with a printed fabric or a single image panel.

This class will build your skills learned in the Quilting 1 & 2 classes. Students' sewing machines must be able to do a quarter-inch seam and a straight stitch. Prerequisites for this class include: 1) Basic Machine Training; 2) Beginning Sewing; 3) Beginning Quilting 1; 4) Quilting Basics One and Two; or, prior approval by instructor.

Supply List

Fabrics

- Fabric panel of a single image at least 24 inches wide
OR
- Printed fabric with at least four or more Images

Note: Hints on fabric selection

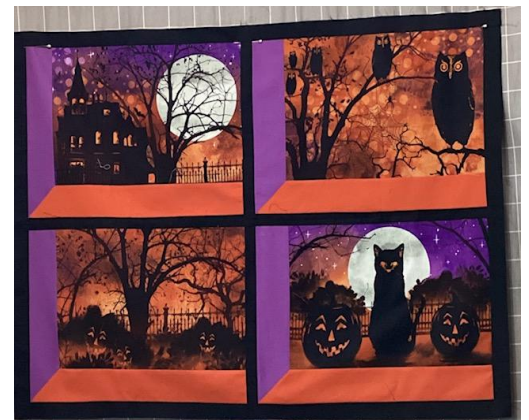
- Fabrics for sashings, ledges and borders to be determined in class

Thread and Sewing Machine

- Needle and bobbin thread: 50 wt. cotton thread to blend with fabrics.
- Extension table, presser foot and knee lift if applicable to your sewing machine
- Zigzag stitch presser foot and needle plate
- 80/12 Microtex sewing machine needles
- Extra bobbins

Tools, rulers and notions:

- 24-inch non-slipping ruler with clear quarter-inch markings, Quilter's Select recommended
- 45-degree Triangle ruler Example Folded Corner Clipper by Creative Grids:
- Rotary cutter with a new blade and self-healing mat
- Finesline chalk fabric markers and a seam ripper
- Travel iron and pressing mat
- Stiletto, glass head pins (heat proof) and scissors
- Pencil or pen and paper to take notes
